The **OMBUDSPERSON** of **Zabarang**

Zabarang assigns an Ombudsperson to provide neutral and confidential assistance to its constituents in order to protect them against unjust treatments and resolve conflicts arise internally. Zabarang's Ombudsperson serves as advocate for fairness, source of support and information and acts as liaison between conflicting parties within the organization.

The ombudsperson is responsible in mediating between two conflicting parties and acts as intermediaries. Ombudsperson usually listens for complaints; participates in investigations and resolutions of the complaints, provides supports to train and disseminate information about the rights, provides consultations in a manner wherein confidentiality is preserved, and recommends appropriate strategies in order to resolve any conflicts between parties involved.

The Ombudsperson conducts necessary researches and writes reports according to grievances, identifies problems and pattern areas and provides necessary recommendations in order to manage certain areas that require improvement.



Goal: Contribute to achieve quality primary education for ethnic children from hard-to-reach areas in Khagrachhari hill district.

Major Achievements 2020

- ▶ 35 pre-primary Teachers received Teachers' Refreshers Training on 'Teaching in Mother Tongue';
- ▶ 34 Grade-I Teachers received 5 days long Teachers' Training on 'Teaching in Mother Tongue';
- ▶ 10 NGPS teachers received Honorarium support to conduct classes for 370 ethnic students from 5 remote Non-Government Primary Schools (NGPS);
- ▶ 372 ethnic children enrolled at 35 pre-primary classes in 2020;

MLE Online School

means of achieving education in mother language

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, all the educational institutions across the country are closed since 17 March 2020. Students started passing their days without books, friends and classrooms. The situation was horrible to them when they were not even permitted to visit relatives. Children were frustrated with this situation. Parents were helpless. In this situation, considering the best interest and safety of the children the government initiated online class for primary to tertiary level. Online teaching for the primary level Ghore Bose Shikhi started on 5th April 2020. Gradually many online platforms opened and became active for primary level too. But, there was no any online platform for mother tongue based multi-lingual education (MLE).

Zabarang Kalyan Samity (ZKS) is a local NGO and a member of MLE Forum technically sound and experienced in implementing MLE programme at field level. ZKS with support of Manusher Jonno Foundation and FCDO has been implementing a project SETU-MLE which


focuses quality primary education through ensuring implementation of mother tongued based multi-lingual education. The project has provided 70 teachers training in Chakma, Marma and Kokborok languages from 35 schools. Zabarang has good reputation in implementing MLE programme. It has good relation with the education officials and language committee members too. The government has provided pre-primary books in the languages of 5 small ethnic groups since 2017. We assume more than 10 thousand Ethnic children would be benefited if we could initiate an online platform for conducting class in MLE.

To promote an online platform for MLE, Zabarang facilitated a virtual meeting. Primary Education Officials, Upazilla Resource Center (URC) Instructor, MLE trained Teachers and the language committee members were invited in the meeting. Giving priority to ethnic children's right to education in MLE, the meeting has decided to open an MLE Online School Facebook page. Officially the MLE Online School Facebook page launched on 9 August 2020. Till date, the MLE Online School could broadcast more than hundred classes for pre-primary class in three languages Chakma, Marma and Kokborok.

At least 4000 students from Chakma, Marma and Kokborok speaking ethnic children attended and benefited through this joint initiatives. "A pool of trained teachers, language experts and education officials are actively involved to make effective this MLE Online School" as Rintu Kumar Chakma, the general secretary of MLE Online School and URC Instructor of Khagrachari Sadar mentioned.

Mathura Bikash Tripura, Vice-President of the management and the Executive Director of Zabarang Kalyan Samity added "it is very good sign that, the teachers who were familiar with smart phone, are performing well in the online classes. Guardians and the

students started to respond, comment watching the live classes". The then Chairman of Khagrachari Hill District Council and Chairperson of the MLE Online School Management Committee congratulated to the management and the teachers for achieving the successful hundredth class in MLE. He had also mentioned, "We can enrich our culture, tradition and languages through this initiative. Project Goal: To holistically support the empowerment of young women and adolescent girls (final beneficiaries), and target key gatekeepers and service providers in order to foster an enabling environment.

Outcome 1: Local CSOs have strengthened their technical, methodological, financial and administrative capacity to effectively respond to the SRHR needs of young women and adolescent girls and foster their rights to live free from violence, coercion and discrimination.

Lampara

a catalyst for social change

Lampara Tripura, 23 year old, is a female mentor of Chhotabari Para girls club under the OLHF project. Chhotabari Para is situated under the Bhaibonchara Union of Khagrachhari Sadar Upazila. The Para is one of the backward areas in terms of awareness on SRHR, Menstrual health, child marriage and women empowerment. Most of the people of the Para are depend on jum cultivation, gardening, day labor and forest resources.

Due to lack of awareness the Para people has a lot of misperception about menstruation. Social taboos about menstruation are existence. Para people are less conscious about child marriage. The girls, young women and parents are not aware about the issue of SRHR (Sexual and reproductive health and right), violence, coercion and discrimination against adolescent girls and young women.

In this circumstance, Lampara Tripura begins to work as Female Mentor in the girls club of Chhotabari Para since 2020. At the beginning she has no idea about the issue of SRHR, violence, coercion and discrimination against adolescent girls and young women. She has also no skill to deliver her speech in front of people. In these circumstances, Lampara Tripura is provided training about life skills and how to operate girls club. She is also provided support session per month on facilitation skill and session conduction. Through these processes she learnt about SRHR, violence, coercion and discrimination against adolescent girls and young women. Her skill also developed on facilitation and session conduction to girls club as well as parents. About this Lampara Tripura said, “It was very difficult to me to speak standing in any meeting, workshop and other events in front of the people. When I did stand to speak something but I couldn’t. After participation in several support session and training under the OLHF project, I feel

confidence. I also have acquired knowledge about SRHR, violence, coercion and discrimination against adolescent girls and young women. I also have known about the negative impact of child marriage.”

Now Lampra Tripura is identified as one of the best performer of Female Mentors under the OLHF project. During 2020, she conducted session for girls’ club members on introduction, team work, communication, gender and cultural event. She also makes awareness the girls’ club members to protect childe marriage in their Para. She also performed as co-facilitator to conduct session for father/ father in law and mother/ mother in law of girls’ club



members in their Para to identify violence issues that affects them most and create awareness among fathers/fathers in law on SRHR and violence issues.

About the session and facilitation one of the girls club member namely Hiranika Tripura said, “Our female mentor Lampara Tripura have been playing a good role in our girls club. She always conducts session for us with very well. Her facilitation and interpretation is very good to understand about the thematic issues such as introduction, team work, communication, gender and cultural event. She also always makes awareness to protect child marriage. I enjoy her session always. So I always come in the girls club when it’s open.”

Mr. Darmajoy Tripura, father of one girls’ club member said, “My daughter Siary Tripura is one of the members of Chhottabari Para girls’ club under OLHF project. She always goes to the girls club. She enjoy the session of girls club. My daughter has learnt about the important of communication skill, team work, gender and child marriage. She always shares with us about the learning of girls’ sessions. Our Female Mentor Lampara Tripura has been performing to run the girls club very well. I think the activity of girls club and the skill of

Lampara Tripura is supporting to enhance the awareness and capacity building of the girls about their rights in the Para.”

Now in Chhottabari Para, the girls club members’ conscious to protect child marriage. The parents of girls’ club members are conscious about on SRHR and violence issues. They are conscious to make free from violence, coercion and discrimination against adolescent girls and women.

Considering the above circumstances, we can say the Female Mentor Lampara Tripura is performing her duty as role model to empower of adolescent girls and young women to make free and informed decision about SRHR, free from violence, coercion and discrimination which are key objective of OLHF project of Zabarang.

Md. Suman is 5 years old. He is the son of Md. Nur and Mrs. Sumi Aktar. He is living in Betchari para under Merung Union in Dighinala Upazila of Khagrachari Hill District. He has one younger sister.

For the past two years, Md. Suman has been studying with his friends for having the benefits of Chittagong Hill Tracts Development Board operated project 'Sustainable Social Service (SSS)'. Para worker Mrs. Mansura Begum is conducting classes in the para center. One day she observed that Md. Suman is not like other 10 students. He seemed to be exceptional to her. Suman could not concentrate on his study properly. Always he would remain silent and used to stay away from his friends. He was taken to the doctors two to three times in a month for treatment. Therefore his parents became worry about his study.

High nutritious of school feeding program operated by Zabarang Kalyan Samity started from 5th December 2019 in the center. Mother



of Suman has stated that physical and mental improvement of Suman has been observed after consuming the nutritious biscuits provided by the project. She said, 'Suman used to avoid taking regular food before. But after starting of consumption of high energy biscuits, now Suman takes regular food and we do not need to bring him to the doctors anymore.' She strongly believes that physical and mental condition of Suman has been improved because of consuming the high energy biscuits.

Mrs. Sumi Akter expressed her feelings happily that she will let her neighbors know about the benefits of nutritious biscuits. She will motivate all parents to send their children to the Para Centers.

A dynamic and inclusive civil society advancing young people especially girls' rights to participation, protection and sexual reproductive health in Bangladesh.

Expected Outcomes:

- 1) Increased agency of young people, particularly girls and young women to act as change agents on sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) including prevention of SGBV.

example of stopping child marriage

Neela Tripura (Nick name), a daughter of Trijagat Tripura and Shachi Rani Tripura, reading in class ten at Gasban Junior High School. She is only 17 years old. Her father is a Karbari (head of the village). They live in Kaptola Para, which is under Perachara union within Khagrachhari Sadar Upazilla of Khagrachhari hill district.

Kaptola para is about 10-15 km away from Khagrachhari town and is located at the foot of tourism spot Mayung Kopal (also known as Hati Matha siri or stairs to the heaven). The way to the village is very winding and quite remote. The village is near to the Y-Moves project area and under the same Union.

Neela Tripura is the third child of the Karbari's four children. She concentrates her studies than anyone else in her family. Naturally she has the highest educational qualification among them.

Neela's school is about 9/10 km from their village. Most of the time, she arrives at home in the late evening, which is usually neither safe nor secure for an adolescent girl. Neela recently falls in love with a boy from a nearby village. During the lockdown time, their schools are closed. But they still manage to communicate each other by any means and decided to get married. Eventually they ran away and got married. But they never thought about their age. The NCTF members from the Paltonjoy Para (close to Kaptola Para)

were informed and decided to stop such unexpected early marriage.

The NCTF members organized meetings with various level of people including the guardians of both the boy and the girl, the UP Chairman, UP members, Karbaries of nearby villages and other socially influential people. Eventually, a community meeting has been organized to discuss the issue. In the meeting, it has been unanimously decided that the two should be kept separately until the girl turns 18 and the boy is 21 years old. The decision is recorded in writing in the presence of both the parents and signatures of all participating social leaders are recorded.



Such success of NCTF members in preventing child marriage was noticed by the local administration. The Upazila Nirbahi Officer encouraged and appreciated their work and said such initiatives should be taken more and more. Child marriage prevention committee should be formed in every neighborhood and school with the elders and teachers of the area. The task of the committee will be to create awareness among the locals about the dangers of early marriage and motherhood. So that no one makes such a mistake again. However, she assured that appropriate action would be taken by the administration if anyone calls to 999 if it seemed more urgent or risky.

Finally, she expressed her determination to work together to build a beautiful society free from child marriage and pledged to stand by the NCTF members in Paltonjoy Para in future








Financial Position in 2020


Expenditure Ratio






